Dr. David Kerns (M.S. 1987), Associate Department Head, Extension Specialist, and Statewide IPM Coordinator in the Department of Entomology at Texas A&M University, received the Award for Excellence in Integrated Pest Management during the Southwestern Branch Meeting of the Entomological Society of America in Fort Worth, Texas on April 20. He is currently responsible for supervising and managing departmental Extension personnel including Extension Specialist faculty and IPM agents. During his career, he developed the first data-driven and comprehensive economic threshold for cotton aphids, conducted IPM research to determine which cotton aphid insecticides were least likely to disrupt natural enemies of aphids, identified a new thrips species and determined treatment options and pest impact, and was among the first to identify the sugarcane aphid, a new and devastating invasive pest of grain sorghum. Dr. Kerns received his B.S. degree in Entomology from Texas A&M University in 1985, his M.S. degree in Entomology from OSU in 1987 under the direction of Dr. Don Peters, and his Ph.D. degree in Entomology from Auburn University in 1992.
